Children's activities at Time + Tide Safaris are tailored to inspire and engage children of all ages on safari. Over and above action-packed game drives, there's a whole host of activities to keep children busy and happy, from sleepouts and tracking with our guides to cooking with our chefs and weaving baskets with local artisans. There's something unique to discover in each of the regions in which we operate.











#### INTO THE WILD

Nothing beats a first-time experience, except reliving it through the eyes of your children. Watch as they marvel at a mighty lion, or witness their little face light up at the sight of a firefly. Big and small, there is so much to see, and our experienced guides won't let the little details pass you by on a game drive. Children can get close to the ground on walking safaris, or take to the water for a different perspective. They can kayak the clear pools of the Liuwa Plain, without the worry of crocodiles and hippo, fish for bream in the Chongwe River, or try their hand at tiger fishing in the Zambezi River. For the ultimate return to the wild, children over 12 can join you on our Signature Sleepout under the Stars, where they will fall asleep under a canopy of a million twinkling stars, listening to the susurrations of the nighttime bush.

#### INTO THE WILD

In the interests of safety, participation of children in game activities is at the discretion of their guide and the minimum age inside National Parks for walking safaris, canoeing and sleepouts is 12 years. Families of four or fewer members, including at least 1 child younger than 8 years, are required to book and pay for the use of a private game viewer for the duration of their stay. Adults are responsible for supervising children at all times.

#### **BACK IN CAMP**

Children under 12 can also learn the art of tracking with our guides on the paths between the rooms. They can choose where to set up a camera trap to see which animals came to visit overnight. Children can learn from the rest of the team too - in the Kitchen, they can help our chefs make muffins for their morning game drive and cake for their afternoon tea, or join the F&B team to learn how to be a waiter and serve dinner for their parents for example. Our team love to share their passion and knowledge of the various elements of a safari lodge with young, aspiring minds.

#### DRAMA, ARTS + CRAFTS

Children can craft their own safari souvenir to take home as a special reminder of their family holiday. They can learn how to weave a traditional basket or hat with local artisans, make a safari-themed pillowcase with Tribal Textiles, or create a custom piece of jewellery with local craftswomen from Mulberry Mongoose, who use only natural materials such as wooden beads, feathers, and snare wire recovered from poaching traps. For an enthralling experience, children can join in on an interactive performance run by a local drama group, where they dress up in costume and dance along to local music.

## CONSERVATION + COMMUNITY

Each stay with Time + Tide Safaris contributes to the conservation and community efforts of the Time + Tide Foundation.
